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1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Quicker Veterans Ben-3 efits Delivery Act".

4 SEC. 2. TREATMENT OF MEDICAL EVIDENCE PROVIDED BY 5 NON-DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS 6 MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS IN SUPPORT OF 7 CLAIMS DISABILITY COMPENSATION.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5103A(d) of title 38,
9 United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the
10 following new paragraph:

11 "(3) During the six-year period beginning on the date of the enactment of this paragraph, the Secretary may not 12 13 request a medical examination under paragraph (1) in the 14 case of a claim for disability compensation in support of which a claimant submits medical evidence provided by a 15 non-Department medical professional, including a non-De-16 17 partment medical opinion, that is competent, credible, probative, and otherwise adequate for purposes of making a 18 19 decision on the claim.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
subsection (a) shall apply with respect to medical evidence
submitted after the date that is 90 days after the date
of the enactment of this Act.

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SEC. 3. IMPROVEMENT OF DISABILITY CLAIMS PROC-

ESSING.

3 (a) PRESTABILIZATION RATES.—Section 1156 of
4 title 38, United States Code, is amended—

5 (1) by redesignating subsections (c) and (d) as
6 subsections (e) and (f), respectively; and

7 (2) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-8 lowing new subsection (c):

9 "(c) PRESTABILIZATION RATES.—During the six-10 year period beginning on the date of the enactment of this 11 subsection, in assigning to a veteran a prestabilization rat-12 ing pursuant to section 4.28 of title 38, Code of Federal 13 Regulations, (or successor regulation), the Secretary may 14 assign such a rating at the level of total, 50 percent, or 15 30 percent, as determined appropriate by the Secretary.".

(b) TEMPORARY MINIMUM RATES.—Section 1156 of
title 38, United States Code, is further amended by inserting after subsection (c), as added by subsection (a), the
following new subsection (d):

20 "(d) TEMPORARY MINIMUM RATES.—During the six21 year period beginning on the date of the enactment of this
22 subsection, the Secretary may assign a temporary min23 imum disability rating to a veteran who—

24 "(1) has one or more disabilities not covered25 under subsection (a); and

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"(2) submits a claim for such disability that
 has sufficient evidence to support a minimum dis ability rating.".
 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
 this section shall take effect on the date that is 90 days

6 after the date of the enactment of this Act and shall apply7 with respect to claims for disability compensation filed on8 or after that date.

9 SEC. 4. TIMING OF MONTHLY PAYMENTS OF BENEFITS
10 UNDER THE LAWS ADMINISTERED BY THE
11 SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 5120(e) of title 38,
13 United States Code, is amended—

14 (1) by striking "Whenever" and inserting "(1)15 Whenever"; and

16 (2) by adding at the end the following new17 paragraph:

"(2) The Secretary may certify benefit payments for
any calendar month in such a way that such payments
will be delivered by mail, or transmitted for credit to the
payee's account pursuant to subsection (d) of this section,
before the first day of the calendar month for which such
payments are issued.".

24 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by25 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to a calendar month

- 1 that begins after the date that is 90 days after the date
- 2 of the enactment of this Act.
